The First Lesson (Acts 4:5-12)

Reader: *A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.*

The rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is
`the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone.'

There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

The Epistle (1 John 3:16-24)

Reader: A Reading from the First Letter of John

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

The Holy Gospel (John 10:11-18)

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. John ✠

People: **Glory to you, Lord Christ**

Jesus said, “I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.”

The Sermon

The Rev. Jon Roberts

Nicene Creed (*All stand, if able*)

BCP pgs. 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead ☩, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

You would be expected to count every three weeks in rotation and the job takes about 2-3 hours depending on the level of contribution. Vacation Bible School is Coming It has been more than thirty years since Calvary has had a VBS. The dates of this historic return will be June 10-14 and we need lots of willing, capable volunteers who can be trained ahead of time.

Kudos Korner With heartfelt gratitude we extend Kudos to the Altar Guild, the Choirs, and volunteers who assisted, for their service in preparing for the busy liturgical seasons of Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. We offer special recognition to Karen Hillegas for her outstanding leadership of the Altar Guild through Holy Week and to all the members who dedicated their time and talent to conveying Christ’s passion. To our Staff and the volunteers who assisted with the administrative effort for these seasons to be successful, we must also give our words of appreciation.

Air Conditioner Update Two weeks prior to Easter, we lost three of our twelve commercial air conditioners. They just so happened to be the largest and most important, cooling/heating the Main Church and Parish Hall. An immediate capital campaign was called by the Rector and there were generous donors who stepped up for the challenge. The total cost of replacement is \$72,000. \$36,000 has been promised to date. The Vestry recently approved use of the Endowment to cover the difference. In the meantime, we will continue to keep the campaign open for those who would like to contribute and reimburse the Endowment. The campaign will end at the end of April. With only two weeks remaining, please designate your gift to the “Keep it Cool” Campaign.

Housekeeping Challenges Many are unaware that we contract one person to come and spot clean the northside of the church (Main Church, Offices, Barge Hall, Meeting Place, bathrooms) and a “team” that comes to clean the southside of the church (Parish Hall, Food Pantry, Kitchen) one to two days every week. We are currently working with each, communicating areas of need, but there has been limited understanding of expectations until now. If any parishioner would be interested in assisting on a routine basis to help us clean our interior (vacuum, mopping, glass cleaning, dusting, etc.) we would be willing to work with obtaining your services for hire or receive your gift of time as a love offering. This is a very large building, and more hands make the work go light.
